Niseko and Rusutsu are located about 100 km/62mil south of Sapporo, surrounding the beautiful Mt. Yotei (1,898m/6,228ft), an independent mountain known as Ezo Fuji. Niseko has four ski resorts spread out at the foot of Mt. Niseko Annupuri (1,308m/4,291ft), with base towns at the bottom of each one, allowing you to move around easily. Rusutsu boasts the largest standalone resort in Hokkaido. Observational data for the Niseko region shows that snow falls for 80 to 100 days during

the winter season, making it one of the places in Hokkaido with the highest powder reset rate. Niseko and Rusutsu are located on opposite sides of Mount Yotei, allowing for the possibility of seamless exploration between the two resorts. You can travel between the two areas in about 1 hour by rent-a-car, cab, or, for public transportation, by Donan Bus and various shuttle buses.

Eat&Drink

In Niseko, many restaurants offer dishes that showcase Hokkaido's fresh seafood, locally harvested potatoes, corn, asparagus, and other seasonal ingredients. Niseko offers an abundance of diverse cuisines from around the world, from French restaurants to bistros, bars, and hamburger joints. Additionally, there is an extensive variety of Japanese foods, such as izakaya (Japanese-style bar) dishes, sushi, and handmade soba noodles, plus Hokkaido's soul foods, Genghis Khan (grilled lamb), ramen, and soup curry, making the options truly limitless. Indeed, Niseko's charm extends to its wide variety of locally produced alcoholic beverages, including wineries, breweries, and the small, long-established sake brewery called "Niseko Shuzo" founded in 1916. Rusutsu Resort boasts over 30 restaurants, which is impressive in itself. However, what makes it even more appealing is the dedication to sourcing premium ingredients from their own direct-managed farms. They take great care in cultivating vegetables, lamb meat, Rusutsu Highland pork, dairy products, and other specialty products.

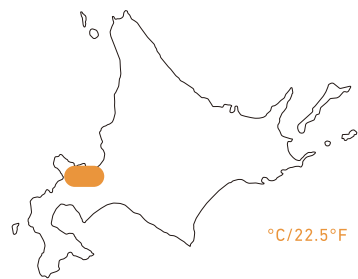

The capital city of Hokkaido known for its abundant food and tourism.

Sapporo is a major city with a population of approximately 2 million people. Starting from late October, it receives its first snowfall, and for over four months, the city is covered in snow, with an average of about 600cm/19.7ft of snowfall. Being the gateway to Hokkaido, it offers excellent access from New Chitose Airport. Sapporo's biggest charm: Skiing, snowboarding, gourmet delights, and urban sightseeing all in one place.

Around Sapporo Station, there are commercial facilities offering a wide range of souvenirs, local specialties, and electronics. Areas like "Susukino" offer a taste of Hokkaido's finest and are easily accessible on foot. In the outskirts, you can find hot spring resorts and other facilities. Just a short trip away, Otaru is famous for its fishing port with fresh seafood, and Akaigawa Village, surrounded by mountains, is home to Kiroro Resort.

Eat&Drink

What makes Sapporo particularly special is not only the snow but also its rich food culture. As Hokkaido is surrounded by the sea on all sides, a variety of fresh fish like salmon, sea urchin, crab, and Atka mackerel are served in various delicious forms in restaurants across the city. The quality of sushi in Sapporo is exceptional. The variety of sushi restaurants is also extensive, ranging from high-end establishments to specialty places offering only "omakase" menus and affordable conveyor belt sushi, all of which provide satisfying experiences. Additionally, Sapporo boasts a wide range of unique gourmet offerings that are specific to the city. Ramen, soup curry, and Genghis Khan (grilled lamb) are well-known and loved throughout Japan.

Enjoying hot springs after skiing is a unique experience in Hokkaido. Just about 30 minutes by car from Sapporo city center, you'll find "Jozankei Onsen," a renowned hot spring with a history dating back to the 1800s. For a resort getaway, Kiroro is second to none. Immerse yourself in a tranquil atmosphere, staying in luxurious guest rooms or cottages, and unwind at your own pace.

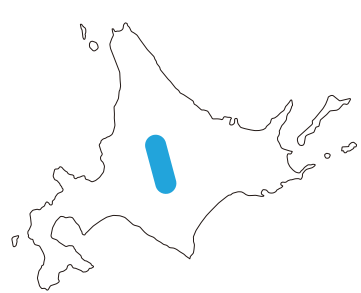

Good snow, good mountains, and good town. It's the Hokkaido Powder Belt.

This area located right in the middle of Hokkaido is surrounded by the Daisetsuzan mountain range and Furano, Biei, and the Hidaka mountain range to the south, offering abundant and rich natural landscapes. Many travelers choose to access the region from New Chitose Airport, Asahikawa Airport, or Obihiro Airport, and enjoying skiing in Sahoro, Tomamu, Furano, and Kamui Ski Links. During the high season from January to February, the temperatures drop to below minus 30 degrees Celsius, making it extremely cold. On the other hand, one of the distinctive features of this region, compared to Sapporo and the Niseko area, is the abundance of sunny days. Due to the region's extreme

cold, the snow quality is exceptionally dry, and the powder remains for an extended period, making it one of the top destinations for snow enthusiasts worldwide. This area, known as the "Hokkaido Powder Belt," is gaining increasing attention. Visitors often base their stay in the largest city of the region, Asahikawa, and explore the surrounding areas to enjoy the powder at various locations. Asahikawa offers a wide selection of restaurants and dining options, making it a great base for travelers. Additionally, there are plenty of indoor activities and attractions to enjoy even during inclement weather, contributing to its increasing popularity among visitors.

Eat&Drink

Asahikawa City is one of the leading agricultural areas in Japan, producing a variety of vegetables and rice nurtured by the subterranean water from the Daisetsuzan mountain range. Since it is located near the center of Hokkaido, the city's market gathers an abundant supply of fresh seafood from various regions across the prefecture. Asahikawa is renowned as a treasure trove of various B-class gourmet dishes. Some of the city's unique specialties include the classic "Asahikawa Ramen," a soy sauce-based soup, "Shio Horumon" made from pig intestines, "Tontoro" featuring pork cheek meat, and "Shinko Yaki," which is half a young chicken grilled to perfection. These are just a few examples of the distinctive local delicacies that can be savored in Asahikawa. On the other hand, resort areas like Furano and Tomamu boast well-developed towns with a wide array of dining options. Visitors can fully indulge in the gourmet delights offered in these resort towns as well. The Shin Furano Prince Hotel boasts a delectable blend of Italian essence and Hokkaido ingredients, expertly crafted by the chef from "Le Gaulois," a Tokyo Omotesando restaurant dedicated to Hokkaido cuisine. It's a culinary masterpiece.

Visitors can witness the unique sight of animals during the winter night, and the park is adorned with ice candles, creating a magical and enchanting ambiance. At Sahoro Resort, the "TAC Tokachi Adventure Club" offers popular activities such as tours to see frozen waterfalls in winter and snowshoe downhill adventures, where visitors can walk, run, and glide through the snowy forest, adding to the excitement of winter exploration.
